Moshannon Valley Students, Staff, and Families,

As we are halfway through the month of July, preparations for the new school year are underway. In our continued efforts to provide families with information about the upcoming school year and be transparent about the possible changes based on current guidance from the Department of Health, Department of Education, and Center for Disease Control, the District wanted to provide the following updates and schedule items:

Athletics

- PIAA Physicals will be offered in the district on **August 9th from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm** at the high school nurse's office. The cost is \$10.00 and must be paid in cash.
- Based on current guidance from PDE and DOH, spectators will be permitted at all athletic contests.

Back-to-School Night

- Tuesday, **August 17th, from 5:00 pm - 6:30 pm** at both the high school and elementary school. Additional details on Back-to-School night will be sent out closer to the date.
- High school students will be able to pick up their schedules at the event.

Meet the Knights & Damsels

- Tuesday, **August 17th, from 7:00 pm - 8:00 pm** at CNB Bank Stadium
 - Junior High and Varsity Football, Junior High and Varsity Soccer, Varsity Volleyball, Varsity Cross Country, Junior High and Varsity Cheerleaders, and Marching Band

Kindergarten Orientation

- Friday, **August 20th, from 12:30 pm - 2:30 pm** at the elementary school. Parents/Guardians should report from 2:00 pm - 2:30 pm for the information session and to pick up their students at the end of the orientation.

Bus Information

- Schedules will be coming in early August, but it is of significant importance to pass along that the Department of Education sent notice on July 5th that ***“under a Federal order issued in January 2021, the CDC requires face coverings, regardless of vaccination status, when on public transportation - this includes on school buses operated by public and private school systems.”*** We anticipate additional guidance closer to the start of school, but wanted families to be aware of the current requirements.

Continued Mitigation Practices

Several mitigation practices from the past school year will remain in effect until further notice. Those include:

- Building cleaning and custodial staff schedules will continue with additional focus on times students are in the building and focus on all common areas and surfaces.
- Temperature Screening will remain in effect at both buildings and students with a fever will have to return home similar to last year.


Free/Reduced Lunch Applications

- The District will continue to participate in the SSO program, which provides one free breakfast and one free lunch to each student. However, families still need to submit and complete the free and reduced meal application to be eligible for other benefits such as the P-EBT program and to ensure their status carries over properly into the 2022-23 school year. If applications are not submitted, students default back to paid status. This does not apply to families with Direct Certification status.
